

Big Sings 24/25

Project Outline

Big Sing is our **FREE KS2 singing offer for 7–11yr olds**. It brings together multiple locality schools at a host school for a half-day singing workshop, led by West Sussex Music Schools Singing Leader, <u>Rachel Maby</u>.

WSM provide resources for two songs for participants to learn prior to the event, which schools rehearse and perform together in a massed choir on the day.

Participating schools also perform a song of their choice with backing track or live piano/guitar accompaniment, which gives students the experience of performing to a large audience.

What to expect

Is it free to take part?

Yes. In order to secure their place, schools have to sign up by **Friday 4 April 2025** and pay a refundable £50 deposit, which will be returned after the applicable Big Sing has taken place. Please note that schools who sign up and then **pull-out last minute** or **fail to attend** <u>will not</u> be refunded their £50 deposit.

How many students can I bring?

Big Sings bring together atleast 3 schools and range from 100 to 300 students. Schools can bring as many children as they like, but it's recommended to not bring more than 100.



Our school can't afford a minibus - can parents collect/drop off children instead?

All host school are able to accommodate pick up/drop-off of students to the Big Sing to ensure that there are no financial barriers to schools in taking part.

Is there anything that I should bring?

We encourage schools to ask children to bring a water bottle and a snack for the short break we plan in the middle of the Big Sing workshop.

Do we have to learn the music off by heart?

Whilst it is encouraged to learn the Big Sing songs and school performance pieces off by heart so that children can focus on their performance and communicating with the audience, it is not compulsory because there will be a screen with provided at every Big Sing.

My piece uses a backing track – will speakers be provided?

Yes – the host schools will have a piano, computer, screen and speakers for schools to use.

The Music

This year's Big Sing theme is birds and flight! We have chosen two mass songs for schools to learn prior to the event, which includes two-part harmony, with additional harmonies for schools who are feeling ambitious!

Big Sing Songs:

Beautiful Creatures from Disney's *Rio 2* by Hosoi and Epstein, arr. by Roger Emerson

This is a fun and uplifting musical song, which is sung by a colony of blue macaws living in the Amazon rainforest to celebrate the return of Jewel, who is accompanied by her family and mate, Blu. It is a fast paced melody, which features off-beat rhythms and an octave range, perfect for developing children's vocal projection in their speaking register.

• Follow the Heron Home – Karine Polwart, arr. Baz Chapman

This folk song was written by award winning Scottish folk singer, Karine Polwart, and released on her 2016 album, Scribble in Chalk. Sing Up co-founder and choral arranger, Baz Chapman, arranged this piece for the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra's Children's Chorus. It features legato melodies with diatonic vocal harmonies and optional descant.

School Song Choice:

Schools are requested to perform one song by themselves, which compliments this year's theme, **birds and flight**. The piece can be a cappella or accompanied by backing track or live instrument (e.g. piano or guitar). Teachers can choose whatever piece of music they like.
